Woman lost security clearance at job due to brain injury

\$1,900,000 Settlement

As plaintiff was stepping off an elevator into the marble foyer of her office building, she slipped on a recently mopped wet floor. There were no wet floor or other caution signs placed at that time. As a result of her

slip, plaintiff fell onto her left shoulder and head. She suffered a traumatic brain injury, which left her unable to work at her top-secret security clearance IT job.

The fall was captured on security video, which was a key piece of evidence in the case.

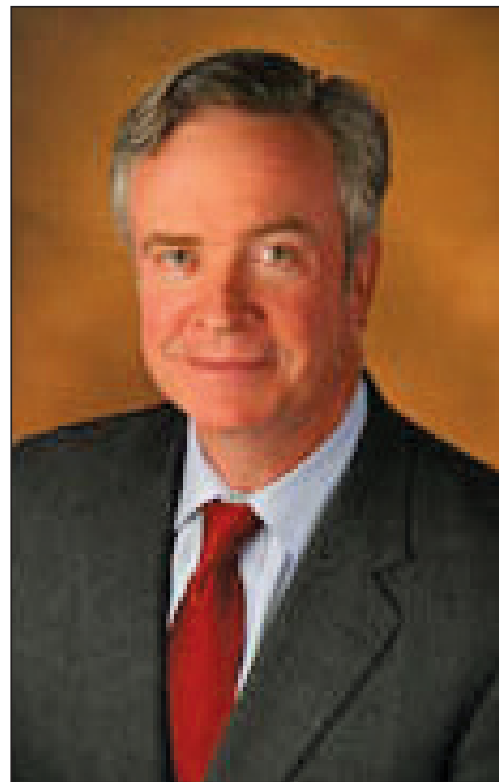
